

February 14, 2013

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on February 14, 2013. All council members and attorney Larry Eaton were present. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Jeff Hamm from the Sports Complex Board reported that Chris Pickett has been selected as the new board member. The jobs for the summer league will be posted, and the sign up forms for summer league will be available at the schools soon.

Jerry Gilpin from the Versailles Lions Club requested permission to use the square for the annual chicken barbecue on June 22, and for the Pumpkin Show September 25-29. John Holzer motioned to approve, Steve Mathes 2nd, motion passed unanimously. Jerry also informed the council that the Lions club has completely renovated the old Spencer Tyson Pharmacy building and invited them to stop in and see the progress.

Ben Sieverding from the Versailles Volunteer Fire Department reported 23 calls since the last meeting. Nick Schwarte is the newest member of the department. Chief Sieverding told the council he got a quote for \$4,300 for the electrical work and programing the new emergency sirens. Duke Energy will set the poles for the sirens.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley met with Hoosier Hills at the water plant to discuss changes that need to be made to the tower and the water plant to be compatible with the new water system. Hoosier Hills has assured the town that the new system will be in place by the end of 2013. Kevin got prices for fertilzer and seed for the sports complex. The cost will be around \$3,300 for both. Parts have been ordered to rebuild the jetter pump. Kevin would like to purchase camera equipment to locate problem areas in the water and sewer lines. The council will discuss the possible purchase at a later time. 15 trees were ordered for the sports complex.

Clerk-Treasurer Kiersten Libby presented a nomination form from Historic Hoosier Hills. Sue Meisberger volunteered to serve on the board. Ordinance number 2013-01 and Resolution number 2013-01 pertaining to the flood plan were unanimously approved.

Steve Mathes reported that several companies had expressed interest in working on the proposed walking/biking trails. Steve will get quotes for signs and posts to direct traffic to and from the sports complex.

Attorney Larry Eaton informed the council that the survey of the property to be deeded to the Legion is complete. Larry will write the deed for the council to sign.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:02 p.m.
