

September 12, 2013

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on September 12, 2013. All council members and attorney Larry Eaton were present. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Jeff French resented a request from Mr. & Mrs. Sizemore to re-zone their property on U.S. 421 to Local Business. The request was approved 3-0.

Fire chief Ben Sieverding reported 35 calls since the last meeting, including five accidents, two gas leaks and one house fire.

Mary McCarty reported to the council that disaster relief funding may be available to fund the town's potential storm water project.

Amy Cornette from the Tyson Activity Center informed the council that they would like to apply for funding for façade improvement on the old Tyson gym.

The Mainstreet meeting was tentatively rescheduled for October 10 at 5 p.m.

Steve Buffington, owner of Steve's Bike Shop, asked if the town could partially block the street on September 21 from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for a bicycle show. The council approved the request 3-0.

Marshall Joe Mann stated that he has been working with the EMA on a disaster relief plan. National drug take back day is October 26. Unwanted prescription medications can be turned in for disposal at CVS Pharmacy from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. with no questions asked.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley reported 3 water leaks in the past month. The sewer line at Graham Creek lift station has been replaced.

Clerk-Treasurer Kiersten Libby presented additional appropriations for several funds. The council approved 3-0.

John Holzer stated that the estimated date for the new water source will be June or July 2014. The town will need to purchase a new computer system to be compatible with Hoosier Hills at a cost of \$28,030.00. Attorney Larry Eaton presented a new contract with Hoosier Hills extending the delivery date for water from December 2013 to September 2014. The council unanimously accepted the contract. John commended Hughes' tree service for trimming the cherry trees in town.

Sue Meisberger suggested that the council request funding from the RSRF for renovating the old firehouse. John opposed the idea, suggesting that the town ask for money for the new computer system instead.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
