

April 10, 2014

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on April 10, 2014. All council members and attorney Larry Eaton were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Fire Chief Ben Sieverding reported 29 calls since the last meeting.

Marshall Joe Mann informed the council that there would be a drug take back on Saturday, April 26, from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. Unwanted prescription drugs may be safely turned in to Marshall Mann at this time to ensure proper disposal. Marshall Mann also noted that cat complaints are on the rise with the weather getting warmer.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley reported two water leaks, one at the water plant and one at the dam. Mr. Hensley informed the council that the water line from the water plant to the legion needs to be replaced. He will get cost estimates and let the council know. Mr. Hensley would also like to increase the wastewater charge for restaurants and businesses. Currently, wastewater charges are the same for business and residential accounts. Attorney Eaton will look into the possible increase. Sue Meisberger received a request from the resident at 621 S. Main Street regarding standing water on her property. The street department will check in to possible solutions for better drainage.

Steve Mathes mentioned that the park board had two people express interest. They would like to have five total members, with one being a non-voting member. Steve motioned to accept the five member board, John Holzer 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed 3-0. The Sports Complex Board would like to purchase a team photo for each sponsor as a thank you. The board agreed to do so. Steve requested that police presence be known at the sports complex as much as possible, as in past seasons. There have been two meetings regarding the SRTS project. The proposal rates are going up, and the plan grant needs to be complete by September.

The council would like to annex the cemetery streets into town. Attorney Eaton mentioned that street signs would need to be placed to mark the streets. The council agreed to annex the cemetery streets into town.

Steve would like to have a standardized letter for Kevin to sign for residents to acquire a building permit. The SRTS would like permission from the town to eventually pave walking trails around the sports complex. No money will be spent at this time, but they would like to obtain a price estimate for a possible future project. The council was in agreement to approve potentially paving walking trails around the complex. The owners of OINC Wireless would like to add a coffee shop to their business and are requesting three parking spots in front of the building.

Marshall Mann presented a price quote for a new camera system at the old firehouse. The three existing cameras would be placed at town hall. The cost would be \$4,300 for 11 new cameras to be placed at the firehouse. Steve motioned to accept the quote as long as the cost does not exceed \$4,300. John 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed 3-0.

John Holzer informed the council that the town's cost for the SCADA improvements to the water system have increased from \$28,030 to \$33,000. The town will match 20% of the cost.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
