

March 12, 2015

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on March 12, 2015. All council members and attorney Larry Eaton were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved, with the correction that the cost to sponsor Girl's State was \$300, not \$350.

Residents Chris and Kari Peck were in attendance to express their concerns about the new water. The Pecks are frustrated with the condition of the water because it is hard, and is leaving residue on their dishes. Council President Steve Mathes said that because the water is purified well water, it is hard, but very good. John Holzer suggested inviting a representative from Hoosier Hills in to address any concerns. John will contact Scott Stirn to set up the meeting.

Resident Jim Jackson, 1202 South Adams Street, requested permission from the council to put a small garden in the right of way between his house and his neighbor. Attorney Eaton said that there is no issue with this, as long as the town has access to the right of way if need be.

Marshall Joe Mann reported that the TAC will be hosting an event on April 4, 2015. There will be a 5K walk/run, and Steve requested that the VPD lead the procession. Marshall Mann said that if he is unable to do so, Lee Mathews should be able to. The Easter Bunny will be available for pictures, either at the Lyons Club building, or the coffee shop.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley reported that the Versailles Home and Garden built a shed over the water line. The owner is aware that if the water line breaks, he is responsible if the building needs to be removed.

Clerk-Treasurer Kiersten Libby presented the RCCF Quality of Life Improvement distribution. The council agreed unanimously to roll the \$955.89 distribution back into the fund.

The council discussed the storm sewer project. Mary McCarty recommends asking RSRF for help with the match fund. The council agreed to apply. The Farmer's Market will begin in May or early June. The main street committee will be in charge of the farmer's market, and any rental fees will go toward the main street fund. Steve motioned to purchase seed for the sports complex, motion passed 3-0. Sue will be assisting TAC with engineer bids for the CFF grant.

Marshall Mann suggested having a few of the decorative stop signs on hand in case one is destroyed.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 7:48 p.m.
