Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on October 9, 2018. Council members Roxanne Meyer and Steve Mathes, and attorney Larry Eaton were present. Council president Matt McNew was absent. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Fire Chief Ben Sieverding reported 44 calls since the last meeting. An open house will be held at the firehouse on Wednesday, October 17 from 6-8 p.m. The department received a grant from the Rising Sun Regional Foundation for the purchase of new thermal imaging cameras. Ben presented information on fire territories.

Marshal Joe Mann presented his monthly report. Marshal Mann has not received any information from the career center regarding the school resource officer evaluation. Joe updated the council on several properties in town in need of repairs.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley reported four water leaks throughout the month. Kevin stated that everything was running smoothly with the town.

The CD at Friendship State Bank has matured. Kiersten recommended closing the CD and using some of the funds for improvements at the new town hall. The council voted to close the CD.

Roxanne reported that the main street committee has been approached about building a pocket park. Roxanne thanked main street, the Ripley County Community Foundation, the Lions Club, and Jeff Haaft for funding and installation of the murals at the Lions Club building. Friday will be the last movie in the park for the season. December 8 will be the annual holiday on the square event.

The council discussed plans for repairs to the old firehouse. There was also discussion about security cameras for the new town hall.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m.
