

August 14, 2018

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on August 14, 2018. All council members were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Judge Cheryl Richmond presented the court expenses and revenue. Cheryl reported that she will need occasional time off in the coming months due to a family emergency. Tamea will cover the days Cheryl needs off.

Jefft Hafft was present to answer any questions the council has on the town hall contract. Jeff gave pricing estimates for the windows, and informed the council that floor covering, etc. would need to be picked out soon.

Brenda Thayer from Lifetime Resources presented a request for funding. Lifetime Resources provides services to the citizens of Versailles, and they are requesting \$1,000. The council will discuss the donation.

Lori Young gave an update on the sewer rehab project. There will need to be some point repair work at the laterals with individual homeowners. The estimated cost to the homeowner if repairs are needed to replace laterals is anywhere from \$20/ft and up. Larry suggested that notification is posted to the homeowners if repairs are needed on their property. Lori will work on a map of the work area, and notices will be sent to those homeowners who may be affected. The project is scheduled to begin Spring 2019.

Fire Chief Ben Sieverding reported that September 5 at 7 pm there will be a presentation at the firehouse to discuss fire territories with the township trustees.

Marshal Joe Mann reported that the Spillman program has been down, and he has had to retype all of his reports. Joe has been traveling to Indianapolis to investigate a car theft that took place in town. Joe gave updates on ordinance violations.

Superintendent Kevin Hensley installed a rebuilt pump at Graham Creek Lift Station. The lights at Pangburn Park are not working, Kevin will contact Duke. The scoreboards at the complex are installed. The vacuum jetter and trailer will be delivered this week. Kevin presented a request from Mr. Hinman for a drain pipe to be installed between his driveways. Kevin will install rip rap, but the council denied the request for a drain pipe.

The resolution for the hazard mitigation plan was signed, as well as the interlocal agreement. Larry presented the resolution to close the town court for the third reading. The town court will officially close October 31, 2018.

Roxanne requested a special meeting to discuss the rental inspection agreement. A meeting was set for September 6.

The town will provide the cake and punch for the Tyson Fund meeting on September 14.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:27 p.m.
