

September 11, 2018

Be it remembered that the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting on September 11, 2018. All council members were present and Attorney Larry Eaton. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Shawn Halcomb gave a final report on the baseball/softball season at Tyson Memorial Sports Complex. There were 275 participants this year, and 25 sponsors. The Junior class maintained the concessions. Shawn completed the equipment inventory.

Steve Buffington requested permission from the council to hold his annual bike show Saturday, September 15 from 7 am- 4 pm. Steve asked that the council close Main Street from 1<sup>st</sup> North to 2<sup>nd</sup> North, and the council agreed unanimously. Steve also thanked the town for removing some of the signs and banners from in front of his shop.

Fire Chief Ben Sieverding reported 103 calls since July. Currently, the department has 30 members and new recruits will start in November.

Paul Sipples from the Versailles Lions Club requested permission to use the town streets for the Pumpkin Show and parade. The Council approved unanimously. The Club has obtained \$18,500 in sponsorship for this year's festival.

Kyle Palmer and Cierra Hudson from Liberty National Insurance presented information on employee benefits. Liberty offers permanent and portable life insurance. The council granted permission for them to allow a presentation for employees on September 19 at 9 a.m.

Marshal Joe Mann gave the council his schedule, and asked questions about comp time. Steve Mathes asked if there could be some formalization of town ordinances. The council agreed that sending certified notices of ordinance violations was the best way to make sure the violations were delivered.

Clerk-Treasurer Kiersten Libby presented the 2019 budget for approval. The council approved the budget unanimously. Attorney Eaton stated that he had not heard back from the DNR or Steve Bedel. Matt McNew signed the agreement for the sewer grant. Bids for the project will be due by 4 p.m. October 9. The council discussed plans for the new town hall, and a bid for security cameras was presented.

With no further business coming before the council, the meeting adjourned at 8:37 p.m.
