On June 10, 2025, the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting. All council members were in attendance along with attorney Lynn Fledderman. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

Roger Kavanaugh was present with a concern pertaining to the boil water advisory. He stated that he did not get the notice. It was suggested that he sign up for HyperReach and spread the word to other residents to sign up.

Randall has two pieces of equipment that he wishes to get rid of. The town will accept bids on a side by side and a dump truck to be advertised twice. Bids will be open at the next monthly meeting.

Tom Cassidy, not present, would like to connect to an old privately installed sewer line at his property on highway 50. Council voted to deny his request unless he comes to a meeting and brings a plan to be reviewed.

Holly requested permission to apply for an Indiana Trails Program grant. Council approved unanimously.

Department reports were received prior to the meeting and were read and reviewed by council. Items on the consent agenda were accepted.

The updated Tap Fees ordinance was read and preliminarily adopted by council. Next month, there will be a public meeting.

Lynn presented a leak adjustment policy. Several changes were discussed. Lynn will revise and bring to the next meeting.

Due to no communication from The Nobel Properties LLC, an order will be issued giving them 90 days to bring the property into compliance.

Ordinance updates for Chapter 28 were discussed. Lynn will make revisions for the next meeting.

Ripley County updated their family housing ordinance and requested that the town adopt it. Council unanimously approved and signed the ordinance.

Roxanne presented the Tyson Fund application requests for discussion. Council approved the application for submission.

Council has determined that there will need to be two practice fields installed at the complex. They will accept bids and apply for grant money.

Roxanne had a meeting with architect Susan Glaser to discuss updating the front of town hall. The plan to move forward has been tabled until the next monthly meeting.

A quote to re-stain the outside of the pavilion was received for \$3025. Council unanimously approved moving forward.

A quote to re-paint 15 trashcans was received for \$2625. Joe Mann offered to have his community service crew complete this task. Council voted to take Joe's suggestion.

The Ripley County Economic Development Interlocal agreement was presented and signed.

With no further business coming before council, the meeting adjourned at 8:51 p.m.
